

Kathua encounter: 2 terrorists killed, 5 security personnel injured, say officials

DGP, Nalin Prabhat, and IGP Jammu Zone, Bhim Sen Tuti, have been overseeing the anti-terrorist operation from Kathua for the past four days

SHADOW CORRESPONDENT JAMMU, MAR 25:

Jammu, Mar 27: A fierce gun battle in a remote forested area of Kathua district has left two terrorists dead and five security personnel injured as the security forces intensified their operation to neutralise an infiltrating group of about five militants, officials said on Thursday.

It was not immediately clear whether it was the same group that had been evading an earlier cordon in Sanyal forest of Kathua region or another batch of freshly infiltrated terrorists.

The encounter triggered intense firing and explosions, the officials said.

The gunfight, centred near Jakhole village in the Ghati Juthana area of Rajbagh, involved a group of approx-

The officials said that two terrorists were killed in the onslaught led by the Special Operations Group (SOG) of the Jammu and Kashmir Police and assisted by the

Adding to the tension, three security personnel, including a Sub-Divisional Police Officer (SDPO), were reportedly trapped near the gunfight's location, adjacent to a rivulet concealed by

dense foliage. The officials said a clear

picture would emerge only after the ongoing encounter ended.

It may be mentioned that a group of terrorists were intercepted by the SOG in the Hiranagar sector of Kathua district on Sunday evening.

Despite a massive search managed to escape the initial cordon, the officials said, adding it is assumed that the same could have been possibly spotted near Jakhole, approximately 30 kilometers from the initial encounter

The terrorists were moving through the forest area when a police party headed by a SDPO moved in after getting specific information, the officials said, adding they came under heavy firing resulting in the gunfight.

The maiden budget session of the assembly post abrogation of Article 370 and bifurcation of the erstwhile ries commenced in Jammu on March 3, having a total of

Chief Minister Omar Abdullah presented the first budget of his government on

March 7. After the demands for grants, the budget was approved on March 25 with the passage of Appropria-tion Bills before the assembly went on a 12-day recess.

The legislative assembly will meet again from April 7 to 9 for the final part of the budget session. The House will also take up private member bills on April 8.

According to the bulletin issued by secretary, J&K Legislative Assembly Secretariat, Manoj Kumar Pandit, seven each private members' resolutions, the relative precedence whereof has been determined by ballot on March 25, would be taken up in the House on April 7 and 9.

Road projects worth Rs two lakh crore being implemented in Jammu and Kashmir: Gadkari

NEW DELHI, MAR 27:

Union Transport Minister Nitin Gadkari on Thursday said the road infrastructure projects worth Rs two lakh crore are being implemented in Jammu and Kashmir. which will boost the connectivity in the region.

Replying to supplementaries during question hour in the Lok Sabha, Nitin Gadkari said, "The government is working in converting 25,000 km National Highways into four lanes from two lanes in the next two

He informed that around 70 per cent of the work of Asia's longest tunnel - Zojila Tunnel in Jammu and Kashmir has been completed.



He added that the project which will provide allweather connectivity between Srinagar and Ladakh is being constructed at a cost of over 5500 crore rupees.

Zojila Tunnel Project consists of construction of a tunnel of more than 13 kilometers and approaching roads to a tunnel of length over 17

kilometers, totaling a total length of over 30 kilometers. Speaking about the other road infrastructure in union territory, he said that 105 tunnels are also being built in Jammu and Kashmir to further improve the connec-

The Minister informed that the work related to 22 tunnels have been completed and another 14 tunnels are being constructed by the Border Road organisation in Jammu and Kashmir.

SRTC bus overturns in Qazigund tunnel, several injured

In all 17 people, including the driver, were injured after an SRTC bus overturned inside the Navyug Tunnel along Jammu-Srinagar national highway on late

Wednesday, officials said. They said the accident occurred around 9:55 PM when an SRTC bus traveling from Jammu to Srinagar lost control due to overspeed and turned turtle inside the tunnel.

"All 17 passengers including the driver identified as Farooq Ahmad, a resident of Budgam, got injured in the mishap," a senior official said.

All the injured passengers were immediately shifted to Emergency Hospital Qazigund Kulgam for treatment, while four among them were later referred to Government Medical College Anantnag for further medical

Following the incident, police registered a case under sections 281, 125(a), and 324(4) of the Bharativa Nvaya Sanhita (BNS) at Qazigund Police Station, and an investigation has been ini-

Authorities cleared the accident site, and the bus was moved
