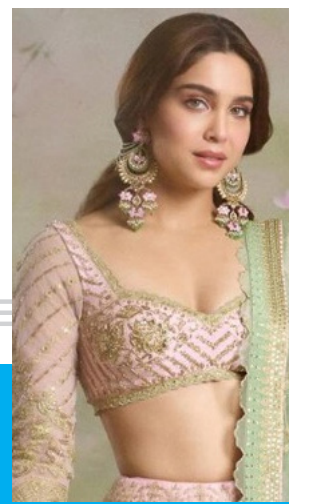

## India will never bow to any form of Terror: PM on Pahalgam Attack Anniversary

NEW DELHI, APR 22:

On the first anniversary of the Pahalgam terror attack, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday asserted that India will never bow to any form of terror and the heinous designs of terrorists will never succeed.

The Pakistan-based terror group Lashkar-e-Taiba carried out an attack at Pahalgam in Jammu and Kashmir on this day last year, killing 26 innocent people, mostly tourists from across India.

"Remembering the innocent lives lost in the gruesome Pahalgam terror attack on this day last year. They will never be forgotten," Modi said in a post on



X". The Prime Minister said his thoughts are also with the bereaved families as they cope with this loss. "As a nation, we stand united in grief and resolve. India will never bow to any form of terror. The heinous designs of terrorists will never succeed," he said.

After the Pahalgam terror attack, India carried out a retaliatory military offensive against Pakistan named Operation Sindoor, in which Indian armed forces destroyed military and terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan Occupied Jammu and Kashmir. Union Home Minister

Amit Shah on Wednesday remembered those killed in the Pahalgam terror attack last year, and said India will continue its zero-tolerance policy against terrorism and those who harbour it.

In a message posted on X, the home minister said, "The grief and pain of losing our people still remain in the heart of every Indian".

"Terrorism is the greatest enemy of humanity, against which we must stand united to fight and defeat. India will continue its zero-tolerance policy against terrorism and those who harbour it," he said. Pakistan-based terror group Lashkar-e-Taiba carried out an attack at P

## No shortage of Fuel, LPG or Fertilizers in J&K: Officers to CS

As part of a periodic review a high-level meeting was today convened by Chief Secretary, Atal Dulloo to take stock of the availability and distribution of essential commodities across the districts of J&K in the aftermath of the recent West Asia crisis that had initially given rise to the apprehensions of impacting the supply chains.

The meeting was attended by senior officers including Commissioner Secretary, FCS&CA; Commissioner Secretary, School Education; Secretary, IT and Transport Departments; Divisional Commissioner, Jammu/Kashmir; IG Traffic; and other concerned officials.

The Chief Secretary emphasized the need for continuous monitoring of the situation to ensure ease and convenience for the public. He directed Deputy Commissioners to saturate the e-KYC of all active ben-



eficiaries under the Public Distribution System within the next two weeks, ensuring transparency and efficiency in service delivery.

The Chief Secretary further stressed the importance of closely monitoring the distribution and usage of fertilizers to prevent hoarding or disproportionate consumption by any individual or entity. He directed that mechanisms be put in place to ensure equitable access for all farmers and stakeholders. He also underscored the need to implement an Aadhaar-enabled distribution system for fertilizers to ensure transparency and fair allocation.

## CM Omar Abdullah visits GMC Udhampur to see injured persons of bus accident

Chief Minister Omar Abdullah today visited Government Medical College Udhampur to enquire about the health of those injured in the tragic road accident that occurred earlier this week. He interacted with the injured and their families, directing officials to ensure the best possible medical care with round-the-clock monitoring.

The Chief Minister, accompanied by Minister for Health & Medical Education Sakina Itoo and Minister for Transport Satish Sharma, conducted a detailed inspection of the hospital facilities. Deputy Commissioner Udhampur Minga Sherpa, Commissioner Transport J&K Vishesh Paul Mahajan, DIG Udhampur-Reasi range and SSP, National Highway, Principal GMC Udhampur, Regional Transport Officer Jammu, Medical Superintendent GMC Udhampur and other concerned were also present.



along with senior officers from the civil administration, police, and medical fraternity, were also present during the visit.

While taking round of the hospital, the Chief Minister inspected the Trauma Centre, ICU, Orthopaedic and Surgery wards, and other sections of the hospital. He met each injured patient individually, enquiring about their condition, treatment protocols, availability of medicines, nature of injuries, and expected discharge timelines.

The attending medical team briefed the Chief Minister on the line of treatment being administered, including surgeries and

other medical interventions, as well as the recovery progress of the patients.

Assuring full support to the affected families, the Chief Minister emphasized the need for stringent measures to prevent such accidents in the future. He later chaired a review meeting to assess both the treatment being provided to the injured and the overall functioning of GMC Udhampur. The meeting was informed about the preliminary causes of the accident and the status of the ongoing investigation.

## Security Audit Conducted at Shiv Khori Shrine in Reasi

## Pahalgam Terror Attack: Ponywallah Adil Shah's Sacrifice Immortalised In History, Says Shinde

MUMBAI, APR 22:

Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Eknath Shinde has said that the sacrifice of ponywallah Syed Adil Hussain Shah, one of the 26 victims of last year's Pahalgam terror attack, has been etched in history and will never be forgotten by the country.

On Tuesday, a newly built house was handed over to Shah's family — an act Shinde described as honouring the brave heart's sacrifice rather than merely providing shelter. Shah, along with 25 tour-



ists, lost his life in the attack by a group of terrorists in Baisaran Valley, a popular tourist spot, on April 22 last year.

He had tried to snatch a terrorist's rifle during the attack and was shot dead. Following this, Shiv Sena

## 12th class Summer Zone results declared, 89.79% students declared qualified

Jammu and Kashmir Board of School Education (JKBOSE) today declared the results of Annual/Regular 12th Class (Summer Zone) areas of Jammu division.

As per the official statistics, a total of 39,309 students appeared in the examination (20,376 boys and 18,933 girls), out of which 35,299 (18,117 boys and 17,182 girls) successfully quali-

fied, registering an overall pass percentage of 89.79%, a notable improvement than the previous year pass percentage of 75.95.

The performance of girls has once again surpassed that of boys. The pass percentage among girls stands at 90.75%, compared to 88.91% among boys.

The examination had commenced on February 23, 2026 and the JKBOSE had established 336 examination centres in the Jammu Division for the smooth

conduct of examination. Interestingly, Government Schools have also performed well by showing a Pass percentage of 87.82%.

## Taking Names of Senior Politicians, Bureaucrats Doesn't Absolve Yasin Malik: NIA to Delhi HC

NEW DELHI, APR 22:

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Wednesday told the Delhi High Court that taking names of senior politicians and bureaucrats does not absolve separatist leader Yasin Malik or negate his links with militants like Hafiz Saeed.

The NIA filed a rejoinder to Malik's reply to its plea for enhancing his life sentence in a terror-funding case to death penalty

and asserted that the Jammu and Kashmir Liberation Front (JKLF) chief was "well connected with multiple terrorist organizations and with supporters of the terrorist organization LeT" and that he dropped names of senior politicians, media personnel, foreign delegates and bureaucrats to gain popularity and draw public sympathy.

The NIA stated that Malik cannot be permitted
