Our Heroes got Global support but unfortunately not from Congress: PM

No World Leader asked India to halt Operation Sindoor: PM Modi

NEW DELHI, JULY 29 :

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday claimed that the Indian armed forces got support from across the world over 'Operation Sindoor' but failed to get any appreciation from the Congress.

Speaking in the Lok Sabha, PM Modi said, "Many things are being said on our foreign policy and global support. I want to say that no country has spoken against India. Only three out of 193 countries spoke in favour of Pak during Operation Sindoor. India, on the other hand, got support from all countries. Our heroes got support from all countries but unfortunately didn't get Congress's support."

He clarified that no leader in the world told India to stop its operations. "US Vice President called on May 9 and said Pakistan was planning a huge attack.



I had told that it will cost them dearly. Today, India beams with self-confidence but Congress is depending on Pakistan for its issues. After the successful surgical strikes, Congress asked for evidence and when we gave the proof, they said they had also carried out such strikes. You want a reason to oppose. The nation is laughing at you," he said.

He alleged that those (read Congress) who ruled for so many

years do not have faith in the country's institution but their trust is created and changed by Pakistan's remote control. "They are asking why Operation Mahadev, under which operatives behind Pahalgam attacks were killed, happened yesterday. After Pahalgam attack they had asked what happened to the terrorists and now they want to know why it happened yesterday," he said.

He also accused the Congress

of trying to do politics over the death of 26 civilians in Pahalgam. "Within three to four days of the attack, Congress started asking where is Modi's 56-inch chest and Modi has failed. They appeared so happy and content. For their selfish politics they targeted me. Their attitude hit our soldiers' self esteem. They don't have faith in our soldiers so are raising questions on Operation Sindoor. Through such attitude they can bag headlines but not find space in the hearts of the Indians," he said.

The PM rued that instead of believing India some people are trusting the misinformation given from Pakistan side.

First the Opposition questioned Operation Sindoor and after the exercise ended, they asked why it was stopped, he said adding, "Congress has always had a negative attitude towards our

Op Sindoor has turned out to be game-changer: Rajnath

NEW DELHI, JULY 29 :

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Tuesday highlighted the significance of Operation Sindoor, stating that it has turned out to be a "game-changer" for India and people of the country will no longer remain just "vulnerable citizens" of a "soft country" but be proud citizens.

Addressing the Upper House on Operation Sindoor, the Defence Minister said, "Op Sindoor has turned out to be a game-changer. The future significance of Op Sindoor is that a citizen of India is no longer a vulnerable citizen of some soft country, but rather a common Indian is now a proud citizen of a strong India."

The Union Minister invoked Game Theory to explain Pakistan's approach to terrorism. Referring to senior Congress leader P. Chidambaram, Singh said, "There is one theory of economics, that is 'Game

'Terrorists involved in Pahalgam attack were eliminated in Operation Mahadev: Shah

Operation Sindoor has exposed Pakistan before the entire world: HM

NEW DELHI, JULY 29 :

Continuing the discussion on the second day of the debate on Operation Sindoor in Lok Sabha, Union Home Minister Amit Shah today informed the Lok Sabha that all three terrorists involved in the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack were killed yesterday in a joint security operation.

Referring to the multi-agency operation carried out by Indian security forces, Shah said, "Modi ji, through Operation Sindoor, ensured that the masterminds of the Pahalgam attack were eliminated. And yesterday, in Operation Mahadev, the terrorists directly involved in the attack were also eliminated."

Aggressively rebutting the charges made by the Opposition leader, Shah laid out the details of the Operation Mahadev which was jointly conducted by the Indian Army, CRPF, and Jammu & Kashmir Police.

The operation led to the elimination of Suleman alias Faisal Jatt, Hamza Afghani, and Jibrán—all affiliated with Lash-



kar-e-Taiba (LeT) and who were directly responsible for the attack in Baisaran Valley, Pahalgam, which killed 26 civilians, including one Nepali citizen.

"Suleman was an A-category commander of the Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), involved in multiple terror attacks including those in Pahalgam, Hamle, and Gagan Top. Our intelligence agencies have solid evidence of his involvement," Shah stated. He added that Hamza Afghani and Jibrán were also high-ranking and wanted LeT operatives.

Launching a scathing attack

on senior Congress leader and former Home Minister P Chidambaram for questioning the origin of the slain terrorists, Shah said, "Yesterday, Chidambaram ji asked what proof we have that these terrorists came from Pakistan. What is he trying to prove? Whom is he trying to protect?"

He accused the Congress party of undermining India's security efforts and attempting to cast doubts about successful counter-terror operations. "It is extremely unfortunate that a former Home Minister is questioning such

J&K Police following LG's Mantra: DGP on Terrorism



Jammu and Kashmir Director General of Police (DGP) Nalin Prabhat on Tuesday reaffirmed his force's unwavering commitment to justice, guided by the core principle of "not touching the innocent and not sparing the guilty", as laid down by Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha.

Prabhat said the new laws enacted by the government are gradually being implemented on the ground and are built around a victim-centric approach.

"The lieutenant governor has a mantra (guiding principle) 'do not touch the innocent and do not spare the guilty'. This defines the duty of the Jammu and Kashmir Police. It is our approach and it remains our constant effort," he said addressing a function here.



The DGP highlighted the role played by police in its outreach initiatives to people in difficulties.

"We do our utmost to reach out to those who are oppressed, distressed or in pain. In whatever way possible, we try to help them and for those who have no support, we stand with them in addressing all their problems," he said.

Speaking at a public interac-

tion, Prabhat emphasized this mantra defines the ethos and functioning of the police force in the Union Territory.

"Our goal is to stand with the oppressed and help resolve their issues," he said.

Highlighting the multifaceted demands of policing, the DGP likened the duties of the force to achieving excellence across disciplines.

"I often tell my team to aim high — like winning a Nobel Prize in Physics, a gold medal in Mathematics or earning a PhD from a top university. We must be ready to play every role and become instruments of real change," he said.

Prabhat underlined that no problem in society is disconnected from police work and said it is

'Modi foreign Policy bankruptcy exposed during Op Sindoor': Rahul Kharge Blames Amit Shah for Pahalgam Security Lapse

NEW DELHI, JULY 29 :

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi tore apart the BJP-led NDA government in Parliament on Tuesday, launching a no-holds-barred attack on the government for its 'diplomatic and strategic failure' to expose the machinations of Pakistan globally during 'Operation Sindoor.'

Gandhi said all that the government wanted to do was to save the image of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who has the "blood of Phalgam in his hands".

"If Narendra Modi has 50 per cent of the courage of Indira Gandhi, who sailed the country through a period of crisis during the 1971 Bangladesh War,



he must admit his government's lapse during Operation Sindoor," Gandhi said in the Parliament.

The Congress leader also picked holes in India's foreign policy. "Not a single word of condemnation was uttered against Pakistan for promoting terrorism by any country in the world.

Operation Sindoor exposed PM Modi's foreign policy bankruptcy. Countries' only terrorism was condemned. Asim Munir was having lunch with Donald Trump. Why didn't the Indian government raise objections to the high-profile meeting at the White House? Rahul questioned.

To substantiate his claim, the Congress leader drew a comparison between the 1971 war era and the Operation Sindoor period, stressing India's war tactics and diplomatic manoeuvres in Indira Gandhi's era were far more superior as compared to Narendra Modi's time.

"Hundred per cent political will and full operational freedom are needed for strategic and diplomatic victories. Rajnath Singh drew a comparison between the 1971 war and the Operation Sindoor era. We also lost aircraft in the war, as constraints imposed by political leadership hampered our progress. In a word, forces'
